### **Overview**

#### **Selected Matters**

- Carmack v. Virginia, No. 19-2075 (4th Cir. Dec. 4, 2020): defended an appeal involving claims under the Virginia whistleblower statute.
- Fallin v. Va. Dep't of Transp., 585 F. Supp. 3d 824 (E.D. Va. 2022): successful motion for summary judgment in a race discrimination lawsuit.



- *Va. Dep't of Corr. v. Garrett*, No. 0456-21-2 (Va. Ct. App. Mar. 8, 2022): successfully appealed an adverse ruling from the state circuit court under the Virginia Grievance Procedure.
- Supinger v. Virginia, 259 F. Supp. 3d 419, 447 (W.D. Va. 2017): successful motion for summary judgment in a lawsuit involving First Amendment retaliation, Title VII retaliation, and race discrimination.
