Overview

He played a lead role in one of the only cases in United States history where the NLRB decertified a union for misconduct during negotiations.

Victor started his career at the NLRB's Puerto Rico Regional Office and later joined another law firm in Puerto Rico, where he was elevated to partner before joining Schuster LLC.

Victor has been a frequent lecturer on labor matters to various professional organizations, including the Puerto Rico Manufacturers Association, the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce and the Society for Human Resources Management (SHRM). He frequently conducts in-house trainings for managers and supervisors.
